

Hour of Code

December 5-11, 2016!

We live in a world surrounded by technology. And we know that whatever field our students choose to go into as adults, their ability to succeed will increasingly hinge on understanding how technology works. But only a tiny fraction of us are learning computer science, and less students are studying it than a decade ago.

That's why our school is joining in on the largest learning event in history: The Hour of Code, during Computer Science Education Week (Dec. 5-11). More than 100 million students worldwide have already tried an Hour of Code.

This year, Glynn A. Green is definitely ready to teach these foundational 21st century skills to our own students. On December 10, 2015, Mrs. Rigg and 50 junior and intermediate students will be participating in this year's Star Wars & Minecraft themed- HOUR of CODE. The students will be learning to program their computers to execute certain commands and complete an activity based in code.

For the past few months, Mrs. Rigg has been working with the junior girls Wonder Club to learn Coding and computer programming. You can research programs including SCRATCH, CODE.ORG and MADEWITHCODE.COM which have helped teach the 21st century skills needed as we believe all students should have access to high quality computer science education. This is a chance to change the future of education in the DSBN. Thanks to Mrs. Rigg for leading us in learning to code.

Parking Lot Safety

Safety of your children is of paramount concern to all of us. Please abide by the following expectations at ALL times:

1. Children who are in Grade 1-8, need to be dropped off and picked up at the fence of the parking lot. Please park your car and then walk your younger children to the opening of the fence to the parking lot. JK/SK students need to be walked over to their teacher at the fence or classroom.
2. When you enter a parking space, please turn off the ignition and park. No idling.
3. Speed limit on school property is 15 km.

Those students who walk to school are to cross with the crossing guard and to walk directly toward the crosswalk (stop light) to ensure safety. It is extremely important that students ONLY cross at the crosswalk. All students that are being dropped off, by parent/caregiver must enter driveway and park to drop their child off at the school. Please remember that students should not be dropped off at school before 8:45 am unless they are part of our daycare services. Teacher supervision doesn't start until 8:45 am. Thank you for your co-operation. Please note that there is not a crossing guard posted at fitness/nutrition breaks.

From Your Public Health Nurse

With so much contact with so many people over the holidays, our school's health nurse Mrs. Germano says:

"Clean Your Hands!"

Cleaning your hands is the most effective way to prevent the spread of germs. Regular hand cleaning with soap and water, or an alcohol based hand sanitizer will reduce the risk of getting sick.

Cleaning your hands should occur:

- Before preparing meals
- Before eating
- After using the washroom
- After coughing or sneezing
- After blowing your nose
- After playing with pets
- After playing outdoors

Use warm water and soap and lather and scrub for at least 15 seconds if your hands are visibly dirty.
