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BUSSING

We appreciate families patience with late bussing. Niagara Student Transportation Services has confirmed that there is a driver for every route but not sufficient spare drivers to cover driver absences. NSTS and bus companies are making every effort to continue to provide service to all eligible students; however, there may be delays.

ENTRANCE, DISMISSAL AND PARKING

Entrance and dismissal times are busy at every school. Parking is often an issue at these times. As an Active Transport School, we encourage all students in the walking zone to use active transport, walking, riding or wheeling to and from school, where it is safe to do so.

The current construction on Pelham Road has led to additional challenges. We look forward to the competition of the work as the plan includes bike lanes and a sidewalk on the school side of the of the road.

Procedures are always being reviewed to improve student safety. Glynn A. Green has made many changes over the years and now has a designated bus lane on Port Robinson Road. We hope that our families can exercise caution and patience to make our students safe. If you must drive your child(ren) to school or pick them up at the end of the day, please put safety first

In the Port Robinson Parking lot, we do have an Handicap Accessible spot designated. We do have families that need to access the spot (near the dumpster). Please do not block this spot and only park in the spot if you have permit to do so.

A reminder to our families that the east end of the bus lane on Port Robinson Road (far end from the school) can be used for a Kiss and Ride for our older students as their zones are on the lower field and they can use the gate in that area.

WALKTOBER

Join families around the world to celebrate International Walk to School Month. Kids who walk or bike to school arrive alert and ready to learn. To teach your child how to be a safer pedestrian, check out tips from Blue the Butterfly. If you live too far away to walk all the way to school, drive to a location near your school and walk the rest of the way. Using active transportation helps



reduce congestion at your school. This October, practice walking to school so you can leave the car at home more often.

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This year, we will continue to return to more normal processes. For Halloween, students are able to dress in costumes as long as they meet the following criteria:

- Students can don or remove costume independently (or come to school in costume)
 - The costume includes a mask (Covid prevention type)
 - Students can use the washroom independently
 - Costumes are appropriate for the school setting
 - Toy and Costume Weapons remain at home
- The costume does not interfere with the students ability to participate in learning.

Weather permitting, we are planning outdoor costume parade (K-6), cohorted classes will observe and participate in a parade on our field. As per Niagara Region Public Health, non-essential visitors are not allowed at school, so we are not able to have parents participate/observe this year.

Teachers will plan activities for their classrooms. Students may bring in some personal treats but as always avoid products that contain or may contain nuts or nut products. Some classes have additional allergies and homeroom teachers will send out additional reminders as the date approaches. Please do not send items for sharing.

For families that do not participate in Halloween or will not be wearing a costume we recommend Orange and Black Spirit Day. We will also have fall activities available. We are also planning a pizza day for October 29th, more details to follow.

Parents and Guardians,


